

Day 1: Journey Begins to Pulaski, WI

As you begin your travels to Wisconsin, you'll stop for a tour of the *Jacob Leinenkugel Brewing Company* in Chippewa Falls. This historic brewery has been in business for 156 years and has been operated by six generations of the Leinenkugel family.

Day 2: Pulaski, WI to Sister Bay, WI

When in Green Bay, you must tour *Lambeau Field*, and you will do just that this morning with a guided *Classic Tour*. This tour features a classic stadium tour, allowing you to see premium seating areas down on the field level through the player's tunnel and learn about the historic organization and stadium. Next, enjoy the *National Railroad Museum*, which consists of indoor displays as well as outdoor displays and features over 70 pieces of historic rolling stock. Enjoy a *Train Ride with a Box Lunch*. The ride will take you along the shoreline of the Fox River and through wooded areas, and the conductor will describe various rolling stock, hobo culture, and more. In Sturgeon Bay, WI, enjoy a guided tour of the *Door County Maritime Museum & Tug John Purves*. The museum showcases the area's rich maritime roots with interactive exhibits and tours of the restored tugboat. You can also tour the lighthouse tour as well. A stop will be made at the *Door Peninsula Winery* for refreshments at this winery that has won over 200 awards for over 60 wines!

Day 3: Sister Bay, WI

Board the "Old Time Trolley" and be prepared to be dazzled by the stunning landscapes that unfold before your eyes. An expert guide will share insider tips on the best places to wine, dine, and explore throughout the county. After lunch in scenic Egg Harbor, enjoy a *Fish Creek Scenic Boat Tour to Peninsula Park Caves*. This insightful narrative boat tour navigates the waters north along *Peninsula State Park's* seven-mile shoreline. Learn about the Park's human and natural history, including the story of the Niagara Escarpment. Have your cameras ready as you cruise past the 145-year-old Eagle Bluff Lighthouse.

Day 4: Sister Bay, WI

The day begins with a ferry ride to *Washington Island*, known for its peaceful, secluded locations and stunning waterfront views, for a guided tour. You'll visit *Schoolhouse Beach*, named after a one-room schoolhouse. This is one of only five beaches in the world that features smooth limestone pebbles and is part of the Niagara Escarpment. You'll then visit the *Farm Museum*, which consists of nine historic buildings collected from across the island. This site will give you a sense of how farming and living on the island was at the turn of the century in Door County. At *Stavkirke*, a Lutheran church built in 1995 resembles an ancient Norwegian Borgund chapel of 1100 A.D. and pays tribute to the island's Scandinavian roots. After lunch, you'll visit and join the *Bitts Club*. While Prohibition ended in 1933, the ingestion of bitters at Nelsen's continued; in the mid-20th century, Nelsen's new owners founded the Bitters Club. The club continues today, and anyone who can swag a shot of Angostura is inducted! After a stop at *Mann's Mercantile*, you take the ferry back to the mainland. You will have ample time to explore and shop at *Island Lavender Gift Shop*.

Day 5: Sister Bay, WI to Onalaska, WI

As you journey home, you'll visit the *Koepsel's Farm Market*, a must-stop for all Door County visitors. This is the oldest farm market in Door County and is filled with jams, jellies, canned goods, fruit butter, bakery items, smoked fish, cheeses, and much more. In Baileys Harbor, WI, explore the *Cana Island Lighthouse*, built in 1869. If you are up to it, climb the 97 steps to reach the gallery deck for sweeping views of Lake Michigan and the Door County peninsula

Day 6: Onalaska, WI to Home

Arriving back in Minnesota, you'll visit the *National Eagle Center* in Wabasha. Sitting on the banks of the Mississippi, which has been newly expanded and remodeled, you'll meet the eagles up close and learn about the eagles' connections to culture, history, and more. Later, at *LARK Toys*, explore the most prominent independent specialty toy store in the U.S. You can enjoy Memory Lane Antique Toy Museum, the hand-carved wooden carousel, or a wide variety of other items on display and for sale. You'll arrive home early evening.



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
